

Getting Started

Request for Name Change (Adult)

IMPORTANT: This getting started guide and the instructions are not legal advice. They are only meant to help you learn how to change your name as an adult. Your use of the forms does not guarantee you will be successful in court.

To learn how to fill out the forms and file them with the court, read the *HOW TO CHANGE YOUR NAME (for an Adult)* instruction sheet and the instructions on the forms.

Names of forms:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Request for Name Change (Adult)</i> • <i>Publication Notice of Court Date for Request for Name Change (Adult)</i> • <i>Order for Name Change (Adult)</i>
Purpose of the forms:	To ask the court for a name change.
Types of cases the forms CAN be used for:	Cases asking the court to change the name of 1 adult only.
Types of cases the forms CANNOT be used for:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cases asking the court to change your name if you are less than 18 years old are not allowed. • Cases asking the court to change your name if you have not lived in Illinois continuously for 6 months are not allowed. • Cases asking the court to change the name of more than 1 adult require a different form. • Cases asking the court to change the name of minor children require a different form.
Special information or papers needed to complete the forms:	Papers relating to your criminal record if you have one. A criminal record may prevent the court from changing your name.
