M.R.18950 - In re: Dean Joseph Konrardy. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent Dean Joseph Konrardy, who has been disciplined in the State of Iowa, is reprimanded in the State of Illinois.

M.R.18952 - In re: Jonathan Vincent Nall. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose discipline on consent pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(b) is allowed, and respondent Jonathan Vincent Nall is suspended from the practice of law for six (6) months.

Respondent Jonathan Vincent Nall shall reimburse the Disciplinary Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension.

M.R.18971 - In re: Deborah Sue Hirschfeld. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose discipline on consent pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(b) is allowed. Respondent Deborah Sue Hirschfeld is suspended from the practice of law for six (6) months, stayed after the first thirty (30) days by a one(1)-year period of probation subject to the following conditions:

a. Within the first month of probation and within the last 6 months of probation, respondent shall undergo a neurological examination with a neurologist acceptable to the Administrator, concerning her pseudotumor cerebri condition. Respondent shall notify the Administrator of the name, address and telephone number of the neurologist and shall cooperate with the neurologist in assessing and monitoring respondent's condition;

b. Respondent shall provide to the neurologist an appropriate release authorizing the neurologist to disclose to the Administrator, on at least a quarterly basis, information about the nature of respondent's cooperation, respondent's medical condition, and any recommended or actual treatment;

c. Within the first 30 days of probation, respondent shall obtain a lawyer mentor acceptable to the Administrator. Respondent shall notify the Administrator of the name, address and telephone number of the mentor and shall cooperate with the mentor in assessing respondent's attention to client matters;

d. Respondent shall authorize the lawyer mentor to disclose to the Administrator, on at least a quarterly basis, information about the nature of respondent's cooperation with the mentor and respondent's attention to client matters. Respondent shall authorize the lawyer mentor to report to the Administrator any lapses in respondent's attention to client matters;

e. Respondent shall attend meetings scheduled by the Commission probation officer as requested by the Administrator;

f. By 60 days before the termination of probation, respondent shall pay \$200 in restitution to Bernard Wolfe and \$1,200 in restitution to Dr. John Jung and provide proof of restitution to the Administrator;

g. Respondent shall comply with the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct and shall cooperate with the Administrator in providing information regarding any investigations;

h. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within 14 days of any change of address; and

i. Probation shall be revoked if respondent is found to have violated any of the conditions of probation. The remainder of the 6-month suspension shall commence from the date of the determination that any condition has been violated.

Respondent Deborah Sue Hirschfeld shall reimburse the Disciplinary Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from her conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension/probation.
