M.R.26555 - In re: Aquilla Wendell Wheadon. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Review Board is allowed. The petition of Aquilla Wendell Wheadon for reinstatement to the roll of attorneys licensed to practice law in Illinois pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 767 is denied.

M.R.27896 - In re: Maurice W. Birt III. Disciplinary
M.R.26382 Commission.

(27896) The petition by respondent Maurice W. Birt III for leave to file exceptions to the report and recommendation of the Review Board is denied. Respondent is disbarred, as recommended by the Review Board.

(26382) The rule to show cause issued to respondent Maurice W. Birt III on November 6, 2013, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 774 and continued until further order of the Court on February 21, 2014 is discharged.

M.R.27915 - In re: Robert Lee Stone. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to file a surreply to respondent's request for hearing is allowed.

The request by respondent Robert Lee Stone for a hearing on the Administrator's petition for reciprocal discipline is denied.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent Robert Lee Stone, who has been disciplined in the State of Hawaii, is disbarred in the State of Illinois.

The motion by respondent Robert Lee Stone for an order directing the Administrator to schedule a hearing is denied, as moot.

M.R.27935 - In re: Joseph Preston Harris. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Review Board is allowed, and respondent Joseph Preston Harris is suspended from the practice of law for six (6) months and until he pays restitution in the amount of \$2,000 to Patricia Banks.

Suspension effective June 8, 2016.

Respondent Joseph Preston Harris shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension.

M.R.27954 - In re: Adelqui Jesus Boue. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent Adelqui Jesus Boue, who has been disciplined in the State of Texas, is suspended in the State of Illinois for two (2) years, with the suspension stayed in its entirety by a two (2) year period of probation, nunc pro tunc to March 1, 2015, subject to the conditions imposed upon respondent by the Grievance Committee for the Texas State Bar and until his period of probated suspension in Texas is successfully completed.

Respondent Adelqui Jesus Boue shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension/probation.

The motion by Brian Dennis Hunter to strike his name from the roll of attorneys licensed to practice law in Illinois pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(a) is allowed, effective immediately.

M.R.28057 - In re: Stanley Anthony Walton, III. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by Stanley Anthony Walton, III to be placed on permanent retirement status pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 756(a)(8) is allowed, effective immediately.

M.R.28063 - In re: Gene Douglas Grimes. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose discipline on consent pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(b) is allowed, and respondent Gene Douglas Grimes is suspended from the practice of law for one (1) year and until further order of the Court, with the suspension stayed after forty-five (45) days by a two (2) year period of probation, subject to the following conditions:

a. Respondent shall continue on a course of intensive outpatient chemical dependency treatment through Nicasa Behavioral Health Services, or another provider acceptable to the Administrator, and shall comply with all treatment recommendations, until successfully discharged by the professionals at that program or the termination of probation, whichever occurs first, with the Administrator advised of any discharge. Respondent shall provide proof of his participation in chemical dependency treatment to the Administrator on at least a quarterly basis;

b. Upon completion of treatment at Nicasa Behavioral Health Services or other intensive outpatient chemical dependency treatment provider, respondent shall participate in a relapse

prevention aftercare group acceptable to the Administrator, at a frequency of at least once per week for at least one (1) year, attending at least 52 sessions, and shall comply with all treatment recommendations, until successfully discharged by the professionals at that program or the termination of probation, whichever occurs first, with the Administrator advised of any discharge. Respondent shall provide proof of his participation in chemical dependency treatment to the Administrator on at least a quarterly basis;

c. Respondent shall continue attending 12-step meetings at a frequency of at least two to three times per week. Respondent shall provide proof of his participation in these meetings to the Administrator on at least a quarterly basis;

d. Respondent shall continue psychiatric treatment under the care of Dr. Daram Reddy, or another provider acceptable to the Administrator, and shall comply with all treatment recommendations, until successfully discharged by Dr. Reddy or the termination of probation, whichever occurs first, with the Administrator advised of any discharge. Respondent shall provide proof of his participation in psychiatric treatment to the Administrator on at least a quarterly basis;

e. Respondent shall remain under the care of a primary care physician and shall comply with all treatment recommendations, until successfully discharged by the primary care physician or the termination of probation, whichever occurs first, with the Administrator advised of any discharge. Respondent shall provide proof of his continued care by a primary care physician to the Administrator on at least a quarterly basis;

f. Respondent shall provide to Nicasa Behavioral Health Services, Dr. Reddy, and all other treatment providers, an appropriate release authorizing the treating providers to: (1) disclose to the Administrator on at least a quarterly basis information pertaining to the nature of respondent's compliance with any treatment plan established with respect to respondent's condition; (2) promptly report to the Administrator respondent's failure to comply with any part of an established treatment plan; and (3) respond to any inquiries by the Administrator regarding respondent's mental or emotional state or compliance with any established treatment plans;

g. Respondent shall abstain from all use of alcohol and submit to random urine or blood monitoring as requested by the Administrator;

h. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change in treatment professionals;

i. Respondent shall reimburse the Commission for the costs of this proceeding as defined in Supreme Court Rule 773;

j. At least thirty (30) days prior to the termination of the period of probation, respondent shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct;

k. Respondent shall attend meetings scheduled by the Commission probation officer as requested by the Administrator. Respondent shall submit quarterly written reports to the Administrator concerning the status of his practice of law and the nature and extent of his compliance with the conditions of probation;

l. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change of address;

m. Respondent shall comply with the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct and shall timely cooperate with the Administrator in providing information regarding any investigations relating to his conduct; and

n. Probation shall be revoked if respondent is found to have violated any of the terms of probation described in subparagraphs (a) through (m) above, and respondent shall be suspended for the remaining period of suspension and until further order of the Court, commencing on the date his probation is revoked.
