**ILLINOIS SUPREME COURT JUSTICES TO ADMINISTER OATH TO
NEW ATTORNEYS**

More than 650 new attorneys will be admitted to practice in Illinois on Thursday, May 8 with Justices of the Illinois Supreme Court and the Illinois Appellate Court presiding and administering the attorney's oath at five separate locations.

All of the candidates have passed the Illinois state bar examination and an ethics examination, and have been certified by the Committee on Character and Fitness.

The largest group, 432, will be admitted in the First Judicial District during ceremonies starting at 10:30 a.m. at Arie Crown Theater, McCormick Place East. Chief Justice Mary Ann G. McMorrow will administer the oath, with Justices Charles E. Freeman and Thomas R. Fitzgerald also participating.

Chief Judge Marvin E. Aspen from the U.S. District Court, Northern District, will give remarks and make the motion to admit the class.

The 661 men and women were certified as candidates and will be sworn in as Illinois attorneys Thursday at ceremonies in the five Supreme Court judicial districts.

Supreme Court Justice Thomas L. Kilbride will preside over the Third Judicial District ceremony, 11 a.m., Main Courtroom, United States Federal Courthouse, 211 19th Street, Rock Island.

Supreme Court Justice Rita B. Garman will preside over the Fourth Judicial District ceremony, 10:30 a.m., Supreme Court Courtroom, Springfield.
