M.R.25460 - In re: Patricia Lynn Hayes. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by respondent Patricia Lynn Hayes for leave to file a response to the Administrator's motion for excess costs is allowed.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission for excess costs pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 773 in the amount of \$11,956.51 is allowed. Respondent Patricia Lynn Hayes is directed to pay the costs in full to the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission within thirty (30) days of the entry of this order.

M.R.27811 - In re: Emmanuel Ezenwa Okere. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Hearing Board is allowed, and respondent Emmanuel Ezenwa Okere is disbarred.

M.R.27812 - In re: Edmund Benedict Moran Jr. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Hearing Board is allowed, and respondent Edmund Benedict Moran Jr. is suspended from the practice of law for two (2) years and until he demonstrates he has satisfied the judgment entered against him in relation to his handling of the Lorraine M. Moran Family Trust.

Suspension effective April 12, 2016.

Respondent Edmund Benedict Moran Jr. shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension.

M.R.27844 - In re: Tanya Yvette Brockington. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent Tanya Yvette Brockington, who has been disciplined in the State of Georgia, is disbarred in the State of Illinois.

Order entered by the Court.

M.R.27845 - In re: Anne Marie Beckert. Disciplinary Commission.

The motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Hearing Board is allowed, and respondent Anne Marie Beckert is suspended from the practice of law for six (6) months and until further order

of the Court, with the suspension stayed after ninety (90) days by a one (1) year period of probation, subject to the following conditions:

a. Respondent shall attend meetings scheduled by the Commission's probation officer as requested by the Administrator. Respondent shall submit quarterly written reports to the Administrator concerning the status of her law practice and the nature and extent of her compliance with the conditions of probation;

b. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change of address;

c. Respondent shall comply with the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct and shall timely cooperate with the Administrator in providing information regarding any investigations relating to her conduct;

d. Respondent shall reimburse the Commission for the costs of this proceeding up to the limits set by Supreme Court Rule 773;

e. At least thirty (30) days prior to the termination of the period of probation, respondent shall reimburse Robert Bauer the \$1,000 paid to respondent for costs;

f. Probation shall be revoked if respondent is found to have violated any of the terms of probation. The remaining suspension of three (3) months and until further order of the Court shall commence from the date of the determination that any term of probation has been violated;

g. Respondent shall continue receiving treatment from her current treating mental health professionals or other mental health professionals acceptable to the Administrator and shall comply with all treatment recommendations, including the taking of medications as prescribed;

h. Respondent shall provide to her mental health professionals an appropriate release as required under the Confidentiality Act of the Mental Health

Code, 740 ILCS 110/1 et seq., authorizing the treating professionals to: (1) disclose to the Administrator on at least a quarterly basis information pertaining to the nature of respondent's compliance with any treatment plan established with respect to respondent's condition; (2) promptly report to the Administrator respondent's failure to comply with any part of an established treatment plan; and (3) respond to any inquiries by the Administrator regarding respondent's mental or emotional state or compliance with any established treatment plans;

i. Respondent shall continue receiving treatment from her current physician who is treating her migraines and shall comply with all treatment recommendations, including the taking of medications as prescribed;

j. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change in her treating mental health professionals or physicians; and

k. If respondent successfully completes the terms of probation, probation shall terminate without further order of the Court.

Suspension effective April 12, 2016.

Respondent Anne Marie Beckert shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from her conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension/probation.

Order entered by the Court.

M.R.27861 - In re: Ronald James Kurpiers II. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent Ronald James

Kurpiers II, who has been disciplined in the State of Florida, is reprimanded in the State of Illinois.

M.R.27862 - In re: Kenneth A. Leeds. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent Kenneth A. Leeds, who has been disciplined in the State of Missouri, is suspended from the practice of law in the State of Illinois for one (1) year and until further order of the Court, with the suspension stayed in its entirety by a two (2) year period of probation, nunc pro tunc to September 30, 2014, subject to the conditions of probation imposed upon respondent by the Supreme Court of Missouri and until his period of probation in Missouri is successfully completed.

Respondent Kenneth A. Leeds shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension/probation.

M.R.27875 - In re: David Jay Peilet. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose discipline on consent pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(b) is allowed, and respondent David Jay Peilet is suspended from the practice of law for a ninety (90) days, with the suspension stayed in its entirety by a one (1) year of probation, subject to the following conditions:

a. Respondent shall continue in his course of treatment with his psychiatrist, Dr. Matthew Mills, or such other qualified mental health

professional acceptable to the Administrator, and during the period of probation he shall comply with all treatment recommendations;

b. Respondent shall provide to Dr. Mills, or such other qualified mental health professional acceptable to the Administrator, an appropriate release authorizing the treating professional to: (1) disclose to the Administrator on at least a quarterly basis information pertaining to the nature of respondent's compliance with any treatment plan established with respect to respondent's condition; (2) promptly report to the Administrator respondent's failure to comply with any part of an established treatment plan; and (3) respond to any inquiries by the Administrator regarding respondent's mental or emotional state or compliance with any established treatment plans;

c. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change in treatment professionals;

d. Respondent shall attend meetings as scheduled by the Commission probation officer. Respondent shall submit quarterly written reports to the Commission probation officer concerning the status of his practice of law and the nature and extent of his compliance with the conditions of probation;

e. Respondent shall comply with the provisions of Article VII of the Illinois Supreme Court Rules on Admission and Discipline of Attorneys and the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct and shall timely cooperate with the Administrator in providing information regarding any investigations relating to his conduct;

f. Respondent shall reimburse the Commission for the costs of this proceeding as defined in Supreme Court Rule 773 and shall reimburse the Commission for any further costs incurred during the period of probation;

g. At least thirty (30) days prior to the termination of the period of probation, respondent shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct;

h. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change of address; and

i. Probation shall be revoked if respondent is found to have violated any of the terms of his probation. The period of suspension shall commence from the date of the determination that any term of probation has been violated.

Order entered by the Court.

M.R.27887 - In re: James Alan Hajek. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent James Alan Hajek, who has been disciplined in the State of Missouri, is suspended from the practice of law in the State of Illinois for six (6) months and until further order of the Court, with the suspension stayed in its entirety by a one (1) year period of probation, nunc pro tunc to October 28, 2014, subject to the conditions imposed upon respondent by the Supreme Court of Missouri and until his period of probation in Missouri is successfully completed.

Respondent James Alan Hajek shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension/probation.

M.R.27900 - In re: James Paul Greene. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose discipline on consent pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(b), as supplemented by joint report of the Administrator and respondent, is allowed, and respondent James Paul Greene is suspended from the practice of law for ninety (90) days and until he pays restitution in the amount of \$2,900 to Virginia Smirnoff and \$2,500 to Raymond Wright.

Suspension effective April 12, 2016.

Respondent James Paul Greene shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension.

M.R.27906 - In re: Steven Wayne Berg. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by respondent Steven Wayne Berg for leave to file exceptions to the report and recommendation of the Review Board is denied. Respondent Steven Wayne Berg is suspended from the practice of law for six (6) months and until he pays restitution in the amount of \$13,184.31 to Terry Simpson and \$12,060.47 to Marsha Ornellas, as recommended by the Review Board.

Suspension effective April 12, 2016.

Respondent Steven Wayne Berg shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension.

M.R.27907 - In re: Daniel Gregory Koryn. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763 is allowed, and respondent Daniel Gregory Koryn, who has been disciplined in the State of California, is censured in the State of Illinois and placed on probation for a period of two (2) years, nunc pro tunc to October 16, 2014, subject to the conditions imposed upon respondent by the State Bar Court of California and until the conditions imposed upon respondent in California are successfully completed.

Respondent Daniel Gregory Koryn shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct prior to the termination of the period of probation.

M.R.27911 - In re: Kathleen Ann O'Dekirk. Disciplinary Commission.

The petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose discipline on consent pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(b) is allowed, and respondent Kathleen Ann O'Dekirk is suspended from the practice of law for one (1) year.

Respondent Kathleen Ann O'Dekirk shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from her conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension.
