## **Emergency Motion to Claim Exemption**

**IMPORTANT**: This getting started guide and the instructions are not legal advice. They are only meant to help you learn how to file an *Emergency Motion to Claim Exemption*. Your use of the forms does not guarantee you will be successful in court.

Names of forms:	<ul> <li>Emergency Motion to Claim Exemption</li> <li>Notice of Court Date for Emergency Motion to Claim Exemption</li> <li>Order on Emergency Motion to Claim Exemption</li> </ul>
Purpose of the forms:	To ask the judge for access to the money in your accounts as soon as possible.
Types of cases the forms CAN be used for:	Cases where a creditor has filed a Citation to Discover Assets to a Debtor's Bank ordering it to freeze your accounts.
Types of cases the forms CANNOT be used for:	<ul> <li>Cases where your accounts have not been frozen.</li> <li>Cases where your accounts have been frozen for unpaid child support or taxes.</li> </ul>
Cost to file the forms:	There may be a fee for filing. If you cannot afford to pay the filing fee, you can ask the court to file for free by filing the <i>Application for Waiver of Court Fees</i> found at: <a href="http://www.illinoiscourts.gov/Forms/approved/">http://www.illinoiscourts.gov/Forms/approved/</a>
Special information or papers needed to complete the forms:	<ul> <li>The name and address of your bank that has frozen your accounts. You can find this in the Citation to Discover Assets to a Debtor's Bank.</li> <li>The name and address of the creditor, or the creditor's attorney. You can find this in the Citation to Discover Assets to a Debtor's Bank.</li> </ul>
